

Affiliates receive EPD updates

Several weeks ago, Angus affiliates, or individuals who are not members of the Association but have recently purchased and received the ownership transfer of a registered Angus bull, received updated expected progeny differences (EPDs) on all active bulls currently in their ownerships. This service is one of the benefits affiliates

receive when their Angus seedstock suppliers transfer the ownership of bulls into their names.

Approximately 35,000 updates were sent to affiliates nationwide. This service is offered on an annual basis following the release of National Cattle Evaluation (NCE) data in December. The update includes the bull's name, birth date and all EPDs available. In addition, a letter

from the American Angus Association accompanies the update, thanking producers for their purchases of Angus bulls and outlining commercial services provided by the Association.

The mailing of EPD updates is designed to increase the service to commercial users of registered Angus genetics and to increase the value of these bulls' properly transferred registration certificates. Special thanks go to Boehringer Ingelheim Vetmedica, Inc., our corporate partner on the project.
