ARCNet helps producers market their cattle

The Angus Resource Clearinghouse Network (ARCNet) is now available to help the industry locate groups of Angus-sired cattle for sale. This new service is provided by the commercial relations department of the American Angus Association and is designed to help buyers and sellers of Angus-based cattle communicate with each other. Both purebred and commercial breeders will benefit from the service.

ARCNet is located on the Internet and can be reached through the American Angus Association's home page at www.angus.org. Potential buyers can access information on genetic background, health, management and planned marketing strategies on groups of

cattle offered for sale. The service will also feature a calendar of special Angus-influence sales, including those sponsored by state or regional Angus associations and individual breeders. Those who don't have access to the Internet can request a copy of the listing via fax or mail.

To place a listing on ARCNet, producers need to complete a listing form, which can be done online or by mail. Contact the commercial relations department to request listing forms or for more information.
