Cattle Industry Convention set to sizzle in San Antonio.

This February, thousands of cattlemen from across the country will be traveling to San Antonio, Texas, for four days of

education, networking, beef industry policymaking, fellowship and fun. The 117th annual Cattle Industry Convention and National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) Trade Show will be Feb. 4-7, 2015, and has a jam-packed schedule with many new events.

The convention includes joint and individual meetings by five industry organizations: NCBA, Cattlemen's Beef Promotion & Research Board (CBB), American National CattleWomen Inc. (ANCW), CattleFax and the National Cattlemen's Foundation (NCF).

CBB and **ANCW** business

During the 2015 winter meeting, Beef Board members will review and evaluate the progress of current checkoff-funded promotion, education, research and information programs aimed at maintaining strong consumer acceptance of, and preference for beef and beef products. Checkoff committees also will begin setting goals for checkoff programs in FY 2016, which begins Oct. 1, 2015.

Beef Board members will elect 2015 officers, including a chairman, vice chairman and secretary-treasurer, as well as members of the Beef Board Executive Committee and the Beef Promotion Operating Committee for the coming year.

The Beef Board welcomes all producers and importers who pay the checkoff to attend CBB and joint checkoff committee meetings at no cost to observe and participate in the decision-making process for their beef checkoff.

The ANCW welcomes all women who support the cattle industry and American's agricultural heritage through education and promotion. Join fellow cattlewomen Feb. 3-4 in committee and in working group meetings related to membership, beef promotion, youth development and legislation.

All ANCW members are encouraged to attend the general membership meeting Feb. 5 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. to celebrate ANCW successes, to find out who will be named the CattleWoman of the Year and to vote on important organization business.

A president's reception will be Feb. 5 from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. to welcome incoming president Melanie Fowle from California.

Beef industry leaders from a variety of organizations will be on hand to interact with collegiate cattlemen and women who'd like to explore the wide world of leadership at the Collegiate Leadership Roundtable Feb. 6 from 11 a.m. to noon.

NCBA Trade Show and events

The NCBA Trade Show will be open Wednesday, Feb. 4, from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.; Thursday, Feb. 5, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and Friday, Feb. 6, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The trade show will include the Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) Stockmanship and Stewardship Corral with live cattle-handling demonstrations by Curt Pate and Ron

Gill throughout the week. New this year is the Low-stress Cattle Handling with Stock Dogs session Wednesday, Feb. 4. The National Cattle Dog Association will present this session. The NCBA-Political Action Committee (PAC) will host a silent auction, plus the NCBA-PAC Tequila and Tacos Surprise Party Feb. 6 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. before the Cowboy Comedy Club.

Additionally, NCBA is continuing the Learning Lounge in the NCBA Trade Show. This will feature 30-minute "lightning sessions" to offer busy attendees valuable educational tips. The Learning Lounge is where attendees can stop in and enjoy informal, face-to-face talks and hands-on technology education in a small intimate theater-like setting right on the floor of the trade show.

New this year is the "Cattle Barn," in which breed associations will bring in cattle to showcase their breed. The cattle will be on display during trade show hours.

Feb. 6 will be the second annual FFA Day in the trade show. Additionally, a new event geared for youth called Renaissance in the Heartland will be Feb. 6 from 9:30 a.m. to 11 a.m., moderated by Tom Field, director of the Engler Agribusiness Entrepreneurship Program at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Renaissance in the Heartland will inspire and challenge attendees to tackle the challenge of feeding humanity, building enterprises and creating jobs in pursuit of the American Dream.

A behind-the-scenes look at the *Cattlemen to Cattlemen* show will be available.

Other events in the NCBA Trade Show include a Nacho Ordinary Party — It's a Fiesta Feb. 4, 4 p.m.-8 p.m.; Texas Uncorked — A Texas Wine Reception Feb. 5, 4 p.m.-6 p.m.; and the Texas Tapped — A Texas Beer Reception Feb. 6, 3 p.m.-5 p.m.

Committee and business meetings

Joint committee, subcommittee and NCBA Policy Committee meetings will happen throughout the week. Producers are welcome to attend and participate in decision-making. However, only committee members can vote. To become a member, contact your state cattlemen's association or state beef council.

Business meetings include new member and first-timer orientation, building beef demand outlook session, federation forum, policy forum, regional caucus meetings, joint checkoff committees, policy committee and industry board of directors meetings.

General sessions

The opening general session officially kicks off the 2015 Cattle Industry Annual Convention Wednesday, Feb. 4, from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. The featured keynote speaker will be internationally recognized graffiti artist and best-selling business author Erik Wahl, sponsored by Boehringer Ingleheim.
