# New year, new show

The 2012 National Western Stock Show (NWSS) greeted its Angus visitors with typically unpredictable Colorado weather, varying from warm, sunny days to nearly whiteout, blizzard

conditions. But the unpredictable weather didn't dampen the enthusiasm for the Angus breed or the excitement about the future of the



Angus business that pervaded events.

As I made my way to the show complex, I couldn't help but think of the thousands of people who traveled to this same arena during the last 106 years.

- An exhibitor with distant hopes of grand or reserve.
- A mother cheering on her aspiring young cattleman in the junior show.
- A fitter rising before dawn in hopes of a win.

So many have left their farms and ranches to come to the stock show grounds, and for good reason. Beginning

in the early 1900s, ranch hands rode into Denver on the rails with their showstrings. The Yards were teeming with cattle, and people crowded into the alleyways in their overcoats with hats

pulled tight against the driving winter wind. They were present not only to compare cattle, but also to exchange ideas.

Today's scene is slightly different. People still gather to evaluate the cattle and exchange ideas, but there are many more Angus cattle here than when I first started coming to Denver 30 years ago. The blackening of the Yards is a signal of even larger changes that have taken place in pastures across the country.

In the same way, the stockyards represent an important chapter in the history of the beef business, all those Angus cattle — and Angus people — stand as an important symbol of our future

Exhibitors entered approximately 400 open and 205 junior Angus cattle in the 2012 NWSS. Once again, the quality of genetics presented at the show and the many associated sales was hard to beat. So, too, was the generosity of many Angus enthusiasts present at Angus Foundation events.

Curtis and Ann Long of Briarwood Angus Farm, Butler, Mo., purchased the 2012 Angus Foundation Heifer Package for \$65,000. Eddie and Connie Sydenstricker of Sydenstricker Genetics, Mexico, Mo., donated the cow-calf pair, with proceeds benefiting the Angus Foundation's many education, youth and research initiatives.

In addition, more than 500 Angus attendees traveled to Tom and Lois Ames' Spruce Mountain Ranch, Larkspur, Colo., for "Angus Night on the Mountain." The successful event raised more than \$45,000 for the Foundation and the 2012 National Junior Angus Show (NJAS).
